Tempus Fugit

Greetings Brother Knights,

Our motto:

"Tempus Fugit, Memento Mori"

Which means:

"time flies, remember death"

As things begin to thaw, we shift our thoughts forward to spring and Easter! The Lenten Message of Pope Francis for 2025 is entitled "Let us journey together in hope."

The papal message—dated February 6, well in advance of his hospitalization—emphasizes in turn each aspect of that title. The Pontiff writes that Lent should be a journey of conversion; that this journey should be taken together, in the spirit of a synodal Church; and that the journey should be inspired by "the central message of the Jubilee," the spirit of hope as we travel toward Easter.

We should consider the six paths toward Easter preparation:

- 1) Fasting and Mortification
- 2) Prayers
- 3) Almsgiving - Almsgiving is tied closely with fasting.
- 4) Good Works - Good works deal with two kinds of actions: perfection of our daily duties and perfection of charity toward others.
- 5) Education - During Lent (and throughout the year) we need spiritual enlightenment.
- 6) Self-Denial - This is the area that tests our willpower.

All of the area churches have Lenten Stations of the Cross planned weekly and St Mathew's is also adding a Soup lite

dinner to their Friday evening Stations. Check the bulletins.

We are in the development of hosting a monthly Pancake meal beginning on April 6th following the 11 am Mass at St Matthew in the Field House basement. Please join us to assist and enjoy our church community.

This is an official invite for you that are not in the Fourth Degree to join us. Our 90th Exemplification will take place on Saturday, April 26th at St. Philip Catholic Church 112 Capital Ave, NE Battle Creek, MI 49017.

What does it mean to be a Fourth-Degree knight? The Fourth Degree is considered the highest degree for our order and is designated as the Patriotic Degree. Members of this degree have the special privilege of holding the title "Sir Knight" and their wives are titled as "Lady". If you join the Fourth Degree you do not automatically carry a sword or wear the honor guard uniforms, this is another segment you may join but no requirements demand that you join. This Degree exists to foster Catholic citizenship with focus on spirit of patriotism. We want our country to see our love for it, while showing our community our Catholic Faith in actions. Today, our patriotism is a bit waning, we have on the other hand, upheld patriotism by supporting our military during times of war. Death occurs; we are only human. Did you know when you die, as a Fourth Degree Knight, the assembly will inscribe YOUR NAME on a new Chalice to be used by a priest somewhere in this world? We have a wonderful ceremony known as the Chalice ceremony that is performed when issuing the Chalice. Chalicees that I am familiar with from our Assembly #510 have been provided to the clergy in mission outposts of Christianity, including Holy Redeemer, Ireland, the Congo in Africa, Japan, India and several monasteries throughout the U.S.

Warriors (Veterans) to Lourdes

Since 2013, the Knights of Columbus has worked with the Archdiocese for Military Services to sponsor the annual Warriors to Lourdes Pilgrimage. This year it will take place during the 65th International Military Pilgrimage on May 16-18, 2025. This is an event that allows active duty, recently retired or separated U.S. military personnel, along with a designated caregiver or volunteer, to travel to the Marian shrine in Lourdes, France for a time of rest, prayer and healing. They do not have to be Knights.

More than 40 countries send their veterans to the site known for its miraculous qualities since the Blessed Mother made a series of appearances to St. Bernadette Souboris in the 19th century. This has been a place of healing since 1858. This event is held in the sanctuary of the Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Veterans gather for daily Mass, prayer and fellowship as they seek healing for their physical wounds, illness or moral injuries. During the pilgrimage, not only is Mass held, but participants can experience the Stations of the Cross, a candlelight procession and have time for personal prayers and reflection. The center of this destination is the washing from the water of Lourdes. This alone draws millions for spiritual, physical and emotional healing. At the closing Mass, the entire basilica is full of service members, all in uniform and all coming to celebrate the Eucharist.

The last couple of years, most pilgrimages are focused on moral injury and other wounds to the minds, hearts and souls of service members and their families. There are many priests and bishops celebrating and many voices in different languages will be heard, praising our almighty God. Our Lady has brought everyone together to find peace and healing. It is very important that our military receive such signs of solidarity and support to know that the values they defend will continue to exist, including freedom to pray in the language they want to pray.

Last year's theme was from Psalm 34: "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." Usually, what veterans receive from this pilgrimage is a notion of celebration, of being together and also raising people up. From one of the participants, "There is so much love here, so much peace. This, I feel, was a pivotal moment, a turning point, where whatever progress I had made before was still minuscule by comparison ... We are grateful for the invitation by the Knights of Columbus to make this possible."

The application period for the 2026 Pilgrimage runs September 15, 2025 thru January 15, 2026. The February 11 council meeting was held in parish hall at St. John Vianney starting at 7:30. Meeting opened with the Our Father and Pledge of Allegiance.

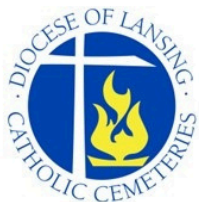
